### Thanksgiving at the Chapter House (continued)

### Kapi's Casserole Style Dressing

Preheat oven to 350. Grease (or butter) a 9x13 casserole dish. (Double for larger group being served)

Melt 11/2 sticks of butter, add 1 cup of minced onion, 1 cup of minced celery and saute on low heat. At the same time, pour ready-made bread cubes into a large mixing bowl (about 11/2 loaves of bread or 2 bags). Bring to a boil about 2 cups of turkey stock, or 2 cans of chicken broth. When onion and celery mixture is soft/clear, add to cubes and toss. Pour stock over mixture and stir well. It should be nice and moist. If too dry, add more stock.

**Seasonings to add:** Salt and pepper, poultry seasoning if sage taste is desired. (Ready-made bread may be seasoned). Cover with foil and bake for about 30 minutes. Remove foil and bake for another 15-20 minutes or until top is a light golden brown.

#### Tips from Kapi:

- Casserole dressing is good if you don't like to stuff a turkey
- Kapi tastes as he goes along
- Giblets can be added if preferred (not everyone likes them!)
- Brown it a little longer if you want a little crunchy top
- A little of this and that makes it a little richer in flavor
- Whatever dish you use try to gauge so it is about 3" high
