In order to mark the eastern edge of our grounds and to provide some privacy, a new fence has been installed along the property line, extending from Logan to Pine Street.

The committee chose a vinyl picket style fence, each slat 1 1/2" square, to provide a wrought iron look and in a style in keeping with the architecture of our Chapter House.

Per city code, the first 20 feet on either end are four feet high, the middle section is five feet high. A three-foot gate was added midway to allow easy entrance/exit from the triplex unit.

This project was financed with funds from our fall Wine in the Garden event, from our endowment funds, and from a generous donation given by one of our residents.

Many thanks to Boise Fence Company who did the installation and removed remnants of the old fence, taking them away at no extra charge!

Remarks from those who have seen our new fence include: "perfect design," "true to the period of the house," "sets the house off," and "it looks like it should have always been there."
