History of Tapas

The Residents Committee of the Board hosted a happy hour in January featuring wine and appetizers from Spain. Board member Carolyn Miller educated everyone on the history of tapas or Spanish small bites.

According to legend, the custom of serving tapas was started by King Alfonso X The Wise who was prescribed large quantities of wine while recovering from an illness. He accompanied his wine with small portions of food. The king then insisted that every household in the kingdom should serve a small portion of food alongside the drink to prevent public drunkenness.

The Spanish word tapas comes from the verb taper, meaning 'to cover.' In Spanish a tapa is also the word for a lid. Another historical account shares that barkeepers covered their customers' drinks with a slice of bread and small piece of cheese and ham as a way to prevent dust and flies from entering the customer's glass.

No matter the history, the wine and tapas served at the Chapter House happy hour were a big hit and there was no public drunkenness.
