# AUTHOR BRINGS CHAPTER HOUSE HISTORY TO LIFE

The Chapter House was delighted to welcome author **Rita Branham Rodriguez**, Chapter A/Boise, who shared stories from her book *The Blue Doorknob: The Life of Cornelia Hart Farrer* with an audience of 22 guests. Rita captivated listeners as she spoke about Cornelia's remarkable life and her deep connection to Idaho history.

"If you want to know the history of a place, you should learn it through a person's life," she said, setting the tone for a presentation that intertwined art, biography, and local history.

Rita began by showing one of Cornelia's paintings—a landscape of Pearl, Idaho—bearing an intriguing handwritten note on the back:

"Leaving Pearl, Idaho—where the Dormans of Caldwell made and lost a fortune in mining. They had the first Stanley Steamer in the Treasure Valley. The present P.E.O. Home in Caldwell was the Dorman family home. Adamae Dorman was in the Pi Phi house at Moscow, Idaho, when I was there—she was chapter president."

Adding to the afternoon's inspiration, Dianne Kane, Chapter N/Nampa shared several beautiful quilts created by her *Stories and Stitches* group after reading *The Blue Doorknob*. Each quilt reflected themes and imagery from Cornelia's life, offering a creative and heartfelt tribute to both the artist and the author

The event provided not only an engaging literary experience but also a touching reminder of the historic ties between the **Dorman family**, **Cornelia Hart Farrer**, and the **P.E.O. Chapter House**—a legacy that continues to inspire art, friendship, and storytelling today.


